**C**arol Bernard Sidney Hartley, aged 88, passed away peacefully on January 10, 2019. Carol was born July 23, 1930 to Dean Hartley and Bernice Blackmon Hartley and (the third of four brothers: Dean, Phillip, Bobby and Michael) in Darlington County, South Carolina. Carol went on to serve his country as a Sergeant in the United States Marine Corp and saw action during the Korean in Chosin Bay. After his service he attended the University of Miami in Coral Gables, Florida. While at UM, he met and married Elizabeth Binney Hartley. He was a beloved teacher at Coral Gables Senior High and activist of teacher rights. Carol loved to talk to people, he painted wrote poetry and songs, loved to sing, and had a beautiful voice. 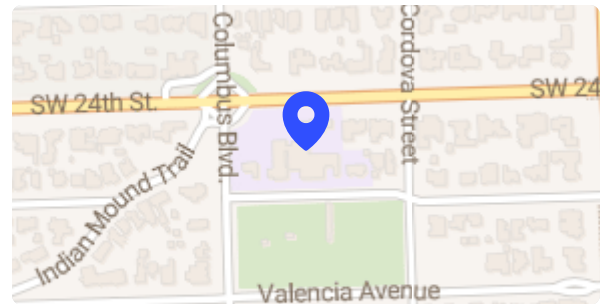

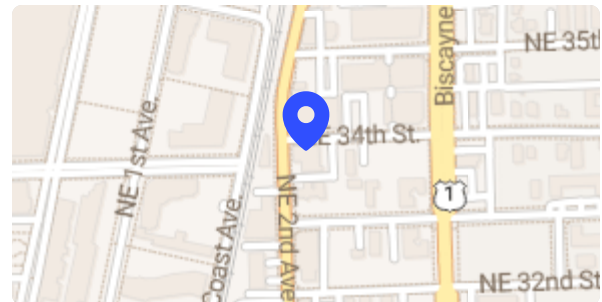
