Not many would be interested in taking care of their baby sister! That was Herbie: kind, compassionate, and willing to serve from the get go. All throughout my formative years and beyond, I was super shy and awkward. Herbie was always there to encourage me to participate in life. He took me everywhere with him...movies, restaurants, trips to Naples, church, etc. He really cared, and I knew that I had him in my corner. I will forever appreciate this. All of you who were in Palmetto youth group know Herbie was always looking for ways to help us learn the importance of helping others. If there was a need, he would round us up to fill it. Turkey dinners to families at holidays, painting elderly people's houses, singing at facilities, and so much more. I truly know that the path I chose in life (to serve others) was greatly influenced by my brother's example. Herbie was always interested in finding ways to contribute to the work that I did as a social worker. One of the things I remember most was when he had his students decorate boxes (the ones that reamed paper came in) for Christmas. He and the kids filled them with candy and toys for some of my families. One mother kept her beautiful box as a coffee table for years! Another family I worked with had a fire in their home, and they lost everything. One of the children lost his baseball collection. Next thing I know I get a care package for the family from Herbie and Toni and inside it was a notebook filled with baseball cards (some of them rare!). That kid was so appreciative, to say the least. Some of my best memories were the time he took the Palmetto youth group to a fancy restaurant (a seven-course meal with linen tablecloths!) for lunch, the "around the world" dinner, helping him put slide shows together, canoeing in the everglades, biking to Naples (well, almost), just sitting by the pool listening to him tell stories. I can go on and on. Thank you all for listening to me brag about Herbie. I have so much more I could say. But, as I try to sum this up, I think what I would say about Herbie is that he had a way of making everyone (no matter who you are or where you came from) feel loved, respected, and valued.
