Ann Thomasson Hutchinson, age 59, of Coral Gables, Florida, passed away peacefully on June 16 after a long illness. Ann was born and raised in Bedford, Virginia, the youngest of five children. She attended Bedford Public Schools and graduated from North Cross School in Roanoke, Virginia, where she was valedictorian of her high school class. She was a 1985 Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the McIntire School of Commerce at the University of Virginia.
